#### **BOAT INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE SEMINAR**

The first Seminar of the season was held April 22, 1989 at the Club House at Cedar Creek Marina. The speaker was Commander Batten of Agro Marine Surveys, 895 Briar Cliff Drive, Toms River, N.J. 08753 (201) 929-2779. The subject was Boat Inspection and Maintenance Procedures.

Commander Batten is a retired USN officer with extensive experience with naval design and manufacturing procedures. He was recommended by BOAT-US although he is a life long area resident, a sailor, and well known as an independent, professional surveyor of power and sailboats for individual buyers, insurance companies and boat dealers.

He recommended techniques to verify the competence of a surveyor including membership in professional organizations and prior experience inspecting similar boats. Above all his report should outline the specific areas checked including the hull, operating equipment, rigging and safety equipment. Inspections should be permitted in all interior and exterior areas including out-of-water hauling. In the water operation should be encouraged as well. Ask questions, don't be shy and establish that the inspector does not have an interest in the situation.

A series of overhead projector viewgraphs was used to illustrate various manufacturing techniques and show typical areas to inspect for stress and fatigue. Discussion of electrolysis, blistering, electrical wiring and lightning protection rounded off the seminar. Copies of Commander Batten's credentials and a topic outline are available for review.

Many thanks to Bob and Donna for the use of the Club House and to Olwen and Bill Jarvis for chairing the session and hosting the seminar with an excellent assortment of snacks and refreshments.

#### 1989 WINDJAMMERS RACE SCHEDULE

#### MAY 20, 1989 - "Cruising Class (A) Only"

Definition: Any boat that raced in cruising class (A) in 1988 season. Any boat that raced in gung ho class (B) in the 1988 season except the following boats: Gentle Persuasion, Piccolo, Tara, and White Wave. The skippers and crew of the above boats are encouraged to crew for and teach those who are less experienced.

#### June 10, 1989 - "1st. Series Race"

Definition: Two classes (A) & (B) will race in a best out of four races for series trophies 1st thru 5th place. A boat must race 3 races to qualify for a trophy.

June 24, 1989 - "2nd Series Race"

July 8, 1989 - "3rd Series Race"

August 26, 1989 - "4th Series Race"

#### September 16, 1989 - "The Best of the Rest" Race.

Definition: Any boat that raced in any 1989 season races that did not finish 1st, 2nd, or 3rd. Once again those skippers and crew that are not allowed to race their own boat are encouraged to crew for the participating boats.

Trophies and special awards will be awarded during "Fall Pig Roast"

#### October 28, 1989 - The third annual "Frost Bite Race"

Definition: One class (A) (B) together. Followed by the 3rd annual "Halloween Party" at the Cedar Creek Club House.

There is a \$12.00 fee that includes all 1989 races or a \$3.00 per race fee if you don't sign up for the season. (Exception: No charge for any skipper entering a Windjammer race for their first time. Skippers meeting 10:00 am at the Cedar Creek Marina the morning of the race!

#### MEMBERS IN CHARGE DUTIES

Assists race chairman in selecting course for that day, setting starting marker and or "A" bouy, registering boats that are racing, secure a committee boat for that days race, and instruct score keeper on committee boat.

5/20, "Cruising Boats Only" - Bill Martin


6/10, "Series Race" - Bob Wexler 7/08, "Series Race' - Max Gaertner
