be doing a little spring cleaning at our club home on **Saturday April 26th**. Back by popular demand, Dock Day is a day where the


Windjammers get together to spruce up our "summer house". We will be removing abandoned items from the marina, planting flowers, possibly painting and any number of other tasks.

The Labor Day weekend will find us heading back down behind Long Beach Island enroute to the Bayman's Museum in Tuckerton for another three day cruise. The Tuckerton trip offers the opportunity to either anchor out or get a slip in one of the marinas on the Tuckerton creek and of course will include a trip up to the museum for the day

along with the chance to kayak or explore with your dinghy along the banks of the Tuckerton creek and enjoy the quiet of the Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. This
